#### ISSRT Annual Conference

quality patient care provided by competent Radiologic Science Professionals.


### Newsletter



# We asked on our ISSRT Facebook page what current students felt about this question: "What is the best positioning trick you have learned to help you with your clinical experience?

## Here is what they said:

"The best trick I have been taught is to use your right and left markers as a guide when placed appropriately. For instance, if you place your left marker on the right leg of the patient, on the anterior portion of your light field (anterior to the vertebral bodies) and at the very bottom of the light field when you are performing a lateral L-spine, then the marker will assist you in positioning for your L5-S1 view. If placed correctly your left marker should be right near that joint so that when you angle for your "spot" you can aim your cross hair more accurately in relation to your marker! After learning this trick I very rarely miss my positioning and always feel more confident in collimating to the fullest, which helps in keeping patient dose to a minimum. This trick is credited to the awesome techs at the Marion, IL. VA" -Justin Holderfield Rend Lake

"I would say that the best advice on positioning I have received so far was for a Scap-Y view. I had a lot of difficulty my first round of clinicals but an amazing tech showed me how to line up the medial border of the scapula to the center of the IR and then center your crosshairs about mid-humerus.
